

Recyclable Material Preparation Guidelines

All material must be clean & dry to be picked up. Do not put material in plastic bags. All items may be mixed together in the recycling bin except glass which must be separate.

The list of Acceptable Recyclable Material includes:

Cardboard, Clean and Flattened, Not mixed with trash,

Paper such as newspaper, junk mail, magazines, mixed office paper, & computer paper,

Paperback books, Phone Books, Kraft Paper Bags, & Empty Aerosol Cans,

Metal cans (labels can still be on), Pots, Pans, Loose Aluminum Foil, etc

Clear Container Glass (Separated, with lids removed, and next to recycling bin)

Plastic # 1 thru # 5 and # 7 (Look for the recycling arrows and number on the container)

(Lids must be removed and lids under four inch diameter thrown in the trash)

The Following Material is NOT Recyclable (NOT ACCEPTABLE)

Styrofoam of any kind (# 6 Plastic), Any dirty or contaminated recyclable material, trash,

Wax or plastic coated cardboard such as milk or juice cartons or butter boxes,

Wax paper, carbon paper, Photo's, Tissues,

Shredded Paper, Napkins, Paper Towels, Paper Plates,

Hard Cover Book Covers, Crayon Drawings, Smoking Materials, Any Plastic Bags,

Mirrors, Ceramics, Ovenware, Dishes, Cups, Clay Pots, Crystal, Window Glass,

Plate Glass, Light Bulbs, Medicine Bottles, Container Lids under four inches,

Unmarked Plastic (No recycling arrows or number), Foil Lined Fiber Cans,

Stretch Wrap, Plastic Packaging Wrap, Wrapping Paper, Film, Green & Brown Glass,

Oil (Cooking & Motor & Hydraulic) Containers, Anti-Freeze Containers,

Needles, Syringes, Bullets, Shotgun Shells, Other Hazardous Material
